

Accessing the Dynamic Purchasing System for the provision of construction, Estates and Property Professional Services

Background to London Construction Programme (LCP) Dynamic Purchasing Systems.

The LCP was established in 2012 and currently has a total membership of 43 London Authorities and Public Sector Organisations. It is a virtual organisation that is hosted and led by Haringey's Strategic Procurement Team (SP), led by the Head of Procurement within the Council. The primary purpose of the LCP is to design, create and maintain construction related frameworks and dynamic purchasing systems to support the delivery of works and infrastructure projects for its members.

Access Agreement

To access the DPS, the London Borough of Haringey requires all LCP Members who intend to use the LCP DPS platform to sign an Access Agreement, which incorporates the licence agreement to use the Sproc.Net software. This will give the LCP Member access to the suite of contract documents and provide them with briefing guides in how to use the DPS, along with a dedicated support team, who will provide any additional support needed to enable all members who commission the required services from the 18 specified service categories.

This enables the LCP to extract and provide information to LCP Members including-

1. The number of Project Registrations.
2. Use of standard forms
3. Through put of work
4. Performance information.

Risks

There are very limited risks to Haringey Council as the projects arising from the DPS are managed by the LCP Members themselves. Haringey is **not** responsible for the delivery of the projects; nor is the Council liable to LCP Member for any underperformance by Consultants or Suppliers on contracts called off under the DPS.

The LCP Member is responsible for notifying Contracts Finder and OJEU (if applicable) of any contract awards that arise from the use of the DPS.

Signature and Date of signing

The Access agreement (incorporating the software licence) will need to be signed by the appropriate person for the LCP Member and counter-signed by the Head of Procurement from Haringey Council. The LCP and Haringey DPS teams will meet with the LCP Member and coordinate the training of LCP Member users.

The process from the point of which the access agreement is signed, to be able to use the system will take a few weeks, dependant on the supply of information from the LCP Member.
